COVID 19 UPDATE: Unfortunately, we have seen an increase in the number of students diagnosed with Covid over the past week. We are also seeing an increase in students coming to school with symptoms (runny nose, sore throat, cough, headache and temps). Parents are reminded to please keep children at home if they have symptoms. If children develop symptoms at school parents will be contacted to collect them. The school will provide a Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) to be performed at home however, once the current supply of tests is gone, unfortunately state schools will no longer be providing RAT tests.

TREE REMOVAL: As previous stated in communications to parents, we need to remove two large trees in the staff car park due to the roots causing damage to our senior hall and to make way for a new senior amenities block. Our school has conducted a revised tree assessment on these trees and unfortunately the assessment has again recommended that `due to these trees current locations and the invasive damage that the trees root systems are causing to surrounding school and council infrastructure, these trees are unable to be managed and require removal'. As stated previously, once the work is completed we are committed to replanting more suitable trees in that area. This work will occur in the coming weeks prior to the demolition of the existing amenities block. Community members are welcome to view the arborists reports.

YEAR 6 CAMP (7/6/22 - 10/6/22): We are looking forward to the annual year six camp at Daradgee Environmental Education Centre in week 8. The Daradgee camp is always an action-packed experience for the students involved and this year is shaping up to be another fun filled four days. It is expected that all year six students attend camp. Camp permission forms and information will be sent home this week. It is of particular importance that we have all details regarding medication accurately documented before camp. If your child takes medication, please carefully complete this information with the camp paperwork. Please Note: School staff will not administer any over the counter medication, including analgesics, homeopathic or prescribed medication unless a written request is provided from a parent/guardian, accompanied by written advice from a medical practitioner and with the medication in the original labelled container.

UNDER 8's DAY: We welcome parents and families of prep & year one students to join in the celebrations of Under 8s day on Friday 20 May. As we slowly transition to a post pandemic world, we look forward to reconnecting with families at events like under 8's Day. Children in prep and year one will be involved in a range of fun activities around the prep classrooms including slime, playdough, bubbles, painting, necklace making, fish kites, face painting and an obstacle course. Please come along and enjoy some time with your kids at school between 8:30 – 10:15am.
